*star-light is a little light* centers itself around simple, pure sonorities and gestures consisting of high metallic percussion and various subtle flute effects. These pure, "little" sounds are sometimes echoed with more dense, noisy gestures in a relationship which ebbs and flows as the piece moves from low, inharmonic textures to high, harmonic sonorities.

The piece was commissioned by and composed in close collaboration with flautist Lana Stafford and percussionist Michelle Purdy. It is dedicated to them in heartfelt gratitude for their commitment, enthusiasm, and artistic contributions.

#### Performance Notes:

##### General:

- Slashed grace notes should be played as quickly as possible; grace notes in brackets can be played with relative freedom within the time of the bracketed duration
- The instruments may be amplified slightly to ensure reception of the quietest sounds; however, the amplification must be regulated to avoid any characteristic sonorities associated with amplification
- There are three types of fermatas used in the piece, performers should feel free to expand or condense these pauses if necessary:
  - short fermata - ca. 1-2"
  - medium fermata - ca. 2-3"
  - long fermata - ca. 4-6"

##### Flute:

- Flute fingering charts are displayed when necessary, over bisbigliandi and multiphonics
- The following abbreviations are used in the score:
  - WT = whistle tone
  - TR = tongue ram
  - = bisbigliando (color trill)
- The following noteheads are used in the score:
  - > = pizzicato
  - x = key click
  - ▼ = aeolian (breath sound)

##### Percussion:

- Vibraphone should be played without motor for entire piece
- Vibraphone and chimes should be allowed to sustain freely, and weights may be set on the damper pedals of each instrument to aid in performance
- Snares on snare drum should be left off throughout the entire piece
- refers to a type of tremolo in which, rather than performing a regular two-hand roll, the performer quickly alternates a single brush (or other mallet) in a subtle back-and-forth motion

- Crotal (high octave)
- Glockenspiel
- Vibraphone
- Tubular chimes
- 2 Finger cymbals (high & low, preferably ~ e & d<sup>#</sup>)
- 2 Crystal glasses (pitched c<sup>5</sup> & e<sup>5</sup>)
- Prayer bowl
- Tuned gongs (pitched c, d, e, f<sup>#</sup>, g, a<sup>b</sup>, b -- any octave)
- Snare drum

##### Mallets used:

- Brass (preferably Ron Vaughn tiny bell mallets)
- Soft yarn
- Wire brushes
- Bow
- Chopsticks (or knitting needles)
- Block mallets (preferably Ron Vaughn med. block mallets)
